Information for visitors to Prince Edward Island and Island residents returning home.

EFFECTIVE JUNE 17, 2021

Apply for a PEI Pass at princeedwardisland.ca/peipass for faster screening at PEI points of entry

- PEI Pass verifies you are fully or partially vaccinated and not required to self-isolate when you visit or return to PEI
- To qualify for a PEI Pass, you must have one dose of COVID-19 vaccine at least 21 days prior to travel (age 12 to 15 are eligible any time after their first vaccine until July 31)
- A separate application is required for each vaccinated person aged 12 and over
- Parents/guardians must complete application for children under 18 who are traveling with them
- PEI Pass can be used multiple times

EFFECTIVE JUNE 17, 2021

 Shortened (8 day) self-isolation for travel to PEI from within Canada (subject to a negative test on day 8)

EFFECTIVE JUNE 27, 2021

Travel from within Atlantic Canada and Magdalene Islands

With PEI Pass:

- Not required to self-isolate
- Tested upon entry

Unvaccinated:

- · Declaration required
- Isolate for 8 days
- Tested upon entry and on day 8

PRIOR TO JULY 28, 2021

Travel from outside of Atlantic Canada

- Pre-travel approval required for visitors
- · Declaration required for Island residents
- Isolate for 8 days
- Tested upon entry and on day 8

EFFECTIVE JULY 28, 2021

Travel from anywhere in Canada

Vaccinated with two doses of COVID-19 vaccine:

- Not required to self-isolate
- PEI Pass required
- Tested upon entry

Unvaccinated or one dose of COVID-19 vaccine:

- Isolate for 8 days
- · Declaration required
- Tested upon entry and on day 8

Estimated timeline

SEPTEMBER 12, 2021

- Some isolation and testing measures may still be recommended for unvaccinated and/or partially vaccinated travellers
- International travel will be dependent on federal measures
- No screening at PEI borders
